Item 1: CALL TO ORDER/ ROLL CALL

Charles Bloom, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM.

Item 2: INTRODUCTIONS

Item 3: APPROVAL OF MINUTES: November 19, 2025

Andrea Allen, WYDOT Project Development, made the motion to approve the meeting minutes from November 19, 2025. Thomas Cobb, City of Cheyenne Engineer, seconded the motion.

No further discussion of the November 19, 2025, meeting minutes, and all approved at 10:05 AM.

Item 4: SAFE STREETS FOR ALL COMPREHENSIVE ACTION PLAN (SS4A)

Charles Bloom, Chair, presented the item into the record.

Jennifer Corso, Metropolitan Planning Organization Senior Planner, provided updates on the Felsburg, Holt, and Ullevig (FHU) Safe Streets for All Comprehensive Safety Action Plan. A Transportation Safety Summit & Workshop was held on February 5, 2026, to receive input and recommendations. Key focus areas have been identified, and

work includes development of the High Injury Network (HIN) Map, which covers 45 miles of roadway segments and 29 high-injury intersections. A Crash Dashboard is also being developed for the MPO website. The plan is expected to be completed in late May or June 2026, with a public input event scheduled in May.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any questions or discussion. Hearing none.

Item 5: EAST ALLISON ROAD CORRIDOR STUDY

Charles Bloom, Chair, presented the item into the record.

Athen Mores, Metropolitan Planning Organization Transportation Specialist, provided an update on the East Allison Road Corridor Study. The study will evaluate roadway, drainage, utility, and multimodal needs along East Allison Road in the South Cheyenne District, and will be completed in two phases, including a review of a potential roundabout at the East Allison Road and Avenue C intersection. A Request for Qualifications was advertised on September 20 and 27, 2025, and the MPO received seven proposals. Stantec was selected to complete the project, and the contract was approved on January 26, 2026. A project initiation meeting with Stantec is scheduled for February 20, 2026.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any questions or discussion from the committee. Hearing none.

Item 6: UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM

Charles Bloom, Chair, presented the item into the record.

Christopher Yaney, Metropolitan Planning Organization Director, provided updates on the revised Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). Two items were revised: Section 4-1 IntuVision Support License and Section 4-2 MPO Vehicle Purchase. Due to cost disagreements with IntuVision, an alternative option, RD Analytics Support License, was selected; however, the total remains at the budgeted \$40,000 due to the need for an additional computer to support the software. The vehicle purchase was replaced with an MPO Website Update to meet ADA and federal accessibility requirements by improving access to plans, documents, data, and public involvement materials, and it remains budgeted at \$35,000. These adjustments do not affect the overall UPWP budget.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any questions or discussion from the committee.

Julianne Monahan, WYDOT Transportation Planner, asked whether the RD Analytics Support License was one of the video based traffic data analysis software options reviewed.

Mr. Yaney confirmed it was reviewed and noted that IntuVision Support License changed its pricing structure from per camera to per site, increasing costs and affecting its selection. RD Analytics offers a one-time fee with annual support but requires a standalone computer. Due to being based in Hong Kong, the software would be isolated on a separate device and network to protect City of Cheyenne systems and data.

Justin Arnold, Laramie County Program Planner, asked about the website backend software.

Jennifer Corso, MPO Senior Planner, confirmed it is WordPress.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any further questions or discussion from the committee. Hearing none.

Julianne Monahan, WYDOT Transportation Planner, made the motion to approve the revised Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), noting the updates to the video-based traffic data analysis software and the MPO Website. Justin Arnold, Laramie County Program Planner, seconded the motion.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any further questions or discussion from the committee. Hearing none.

Roll Call: Motion to approve the Revised Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) passed unanimously.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any questions or discussion from the committee regarding city projects. Hearing none.

Molly Cook, Laramie County Public Works Director, noted the current Laramie County projects.

Current Projects:

- Chalk Bluff Road - Under construction in 2026
- Division and Wallick - Design phase
- Road 164 - Design and build
- Jefferson/Allison - Post for proposals anticipated
- Roundtop Road - Currently in design phase
- Normal maintenance on gravel and pavement
- Chip Seal Projects - Various paved county roads out for bids

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any questions or discussion from the committee regarding county projects.

Justin Arnold, Laramie County Program Planner, noted updates regarding funding related to Chalk Bluff Road.

Mr. Bloom inquired whether the funding covered 100 percent of the estimated cost or included an inflation factor.

Ms. Cook noted the MOU provides approximately \$14.5 million for design and construction, with funding from an external source and a \$2.5 million county contribution. The final construction cost will be determined after bidding, and the MOU includes provisions if costs exceed certain thresholds.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any further questions or discussion from the committee regarding county projects. Hearing none.

Ryan Shields, WYDOT District Construction Engineer, noted updates to the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) projects.

2026

- College Drive (S. Greeley Highway & I-80); Hynds Boulevard (Vandehei & Horse Creek Road) - Chip Seal
- Missile Drive/Happy Jack Road (I-25 and FE Warren Gate 2 Entrance) - Concrete Slab Replacement
- I-25 Bridges over Clear Creek (north of College Drive Interchange) - Bridge Rehabilitation
- Whitney/Dell Range (City & County Project w/ Fed. Funds) - Roadway Reconstruction & Realignment, and Traffic Signals

2027

- Central Avenue (Pershing to 22nd) - Overlay, ADA Corners, Traffic Signal, and Pedestrian Improvements
- College Drive (Fox Farm to Campstool) - Concrete Pavement Replacement, Bridge Rehab, and Traffic Signal Improvements

- College Drive & Parsley Intersection - Intersection Lighting (Safety Project)

Mr. Shields noted that WYDOT secured grant funding to construct a bridge over the at grade rail crossing at College Drive. The project is advancing, with construction anticipated in 2031 or 2032. Public input is encouraged, and a preliminary public input phase is anticipated in March 2026.

Mr. Bloom asked if there were any questions or discussion from the committee regarding WYDOT projects. Hearing none.

Item 8: OTHER BUSINESS

Charles Bloom, Chair, opened the meeting for any other business from staff or the committee.

Julianne Monahan, WYDOT Transportation Planner, inquired about the City Co-Op.

Thomas Cobb, City of Cheyenne Engineer, noted that the document is filed with City Clerk.

Mr. Bloom noted that coordination is occurring with Lotus Engineering Sustainability to complete the Community Climate Action Plan. The plan is funded by a \$1 million federal grant, and an invitation has been forwarded to provide comments. Comments can be submitted via the Word document on the OneDrive file.
